


Selection of Degree Scenario and Course Registration Guidelines for 3rd Semester Students


These are the minimum guidelines for the Liberal Arts student who are entering into the 3rd semester, where they have to select the Degree Scenario and Courses.

SELECTION OF DEGREE SCENARIOS

- i. The student has to login his/her CMS account.
- ii. Go to the Course Registration.
- iii. The CMS will show different degree scenarios.




- iv. For an example, if the student selects Degree with One Major, its proposed sequencing will come, which will be telling the student that how many minimum courses you have to take to complete the degree with selected scenario.







REGISTRATION OF 3RD SEMESTER COURSES

In the 3rd semester the student has to take 3 General Education Courses such as:


- i. Expository Writing-III
- ii. Civilizational Course 1 (Pakistan Studies)
- iii. Civilizational Course 2 (Islamic Studies)

Other than these 3 General Education Courses (Compulsory), the student has to choose 2 more courses based on the Degree Scenario.


For an example, if the student is going with Degree with One Major, then he/she has to select 1 Course as Major and 1 Course as Distribution of related domain.

The student has to go on “**Course Registration**” on the CMS once again.

- i. A course registration form will appear as follows:



- ii. The student has to select then Course by a click. After the click, the course(s) will show.



- iii. When the student will select the course, the timetables of the course will be shown to the student. The student has to **Choose** the section in which he/she wants to register.

- In the first 3 semesters, the student will be studying General Education (GE) courses under: Quantitative Reasoning, Natural Sciences, Arts & Humanities, Social Sciences, and Expository Writing. The student will choose 5 courses (ONE course from each discipline) from the options (courses) being offered against each discipline.
- The student CAN NOT choose more than ONE course from the same category.
- The course(s) offerings are subject to the availability of seats. The course will be removed from the list of offered courses once the seats are full.
- It is strongly recommended that the students should register for their courses after thorough deliberation and consultation with their academic advisor.

v. The student has to **select his/her own timetable** as well, so the student must look into the timings of different sections and choose those section which classes do not clash with each other.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

What are the Degree Scenarios?

In the 3rd semester, the student has to opt either he/she wants to do one major, two majors, one major-one minor, or one major-two minors.

What does mean by Degree with One Major?

Degree with One Major means the student want to go with only one program, such as BS in Economics.

What does mean by Degree with Two Majors?

The Degree with Two Majors means, the student wants to go with major in two different subjects of ***related domains***. Such as BS in Economics and Mathematics.

What does mean by Degree with One Major and One Minor?

The Degree with One Major and One Minor means, the student wants to go with combination of one major and one minor subject of ***related domains***. Such as BS in Economics with Mathematics.

What does mean by Degree with One Major and Two Minors?

The Degree with One Major and Two Minors means, the student wants to go with combination of one major s and two minor subjects of ***related domains***. Such as BS in Economics with (Mathematics & Statistics).

There is difference of minimum time duration and fee for different degree scenarios?

The student can complete any of degree scenario with in 4 years with minimum required courses.

The fee will be different for different degree scenarios depending on the fee structures of different subjects.

How the student should choice the degree scenarios?

The student must consult with his/her academic advisor, and after discussion and with the advice of the academic advisor select the degree scenarios.
